After I have been busy for more than one year, to contact everybody who has something to do with Ghana, by email, phone and letters, I got in contact with Priest Frans Meddens. With Priest Meddens I started this project what I will carry out in Ghana. Priest Meddens lived for 10 years in Ghana and is doing development aid for more than 40 years! I already learned a lot from Priest Meddens and continue his work given that he is at middle age.

By Priest Meddens I got in contact with Joseph Wuni.

Joseph Wuni is a Ghanian who cooperates with Dutch people for many years.

They are both active in the foundation which is called in Holland 'Holland Ghana Platform' and in Ghana 'Ghana Holland Platform'. In this foundation, different organisations are working together. The projects which Dutch people started in Ghana are, after a while, taken over by the Ghanian people. And Joseph Wuni has an important role in that part.
